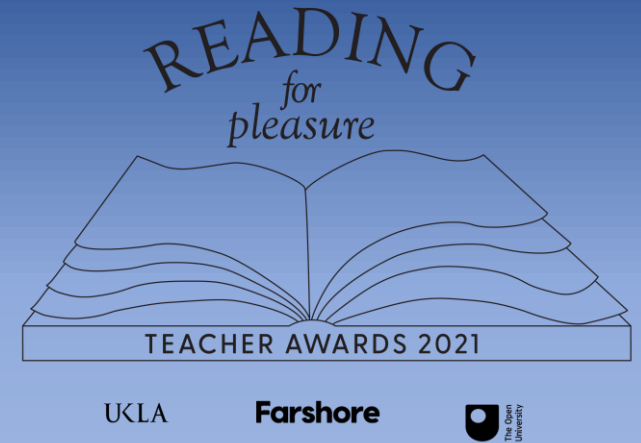
The Farshore (formerly Egmont) Reading for Pleasure Teacher Awards recognise those teachers and schools who really make a difference.

Award Categories

- Early career teacher (0-3 years in teaching)
 - Experienced teacher (3 years plus)
 - Whole school award
 - School Reading Champion
 - Community Reading Champion



Entry Criteria

Submit a research-informed case study on how you have encouraged children to read for pleasure. Show details of context, research inspiration and rationale, aims, outline, evidence of impact and reflections. The judges will pay particular attention to the following strands of the submission:

- 1.1) The importance of teachers' knowledge of children's literature and other texts.
- 1.2) The importance of a child's free choice of reading material and of offering a range of texts to engage their interest, be it classics, series fiction, graphic novels, picture books, comics and magazines, funny books, factual books etc.
- 2) The importance of reading aloud to children and its role in promoting children's motivation and their independent reading for pleasure.
- 3) The importance of building communities of readers by working with parents/carers:
 - To promote the value of reading for pleasure
 - To support them in reading to their children
 - To establish reading for pleasure as a joyful and regular occurrence at home
- 4) Overcoming the challenge of school accountability pressures, where reading for pleasure runs the risk of being seen as 'yet more to do' by teachers, and as a lesson by pupils.

The case study should be a minimum of 1000 words, maximum of 1500 words.
